



Nils Chr. Stenseth

Élu Associé étranger le 21 juin 2005, dans la section de Biologie intégrative

Nils Chr. Stenseth, né en 1949 en Norvège, Professeur d'écologie et d'évolution à l'université d'Oslo, a consacré ses recherches à la dynamique spatio-temporelle des populations et des communautés par la modélisation statistique de données écologiques à long terme dans une perspective de biologie évolutive. Les travaux qui lui ont valu une réputation internationale ont montré les facteurs environnementaux responsables des cycles de variations des populations de rongeurs et de leurs prédateurs en Arctique. Nils Chr. Stenseth s'est également intéressé aux processus qui ont conduit à la disparition des bancs de morue et aux conditions qui pourraient permettre leur reconstitution ainsi qu'à l'impact de l'effet El Nino et de l'oscillation Nord Atlantique sur les écosystèmes marins.

Nils Chr. Stenseth is Professor at the University of Oslo, where he is the head of the Department of Ecology and Evolution. His research is essentially dealing with the spatio-temporal dynamics of populations and communities by a statistical modelisation of long term ecological data within an evolutionary perspective. He is internationally recognized for his work which enabled to identify those environmental factors involved in the variation cycles of the populations cycles of arctic rodents and of their predators. But he has huge and diverse interests and for example he studied those processes involved in the drop of cod populations and in the conditions that would allow their restoration. He also investigated the impact of El Nino and of the North Atlantic oscillation on marine ecosystems.
